

# Career Transitions Talking Points

- **What is Career Transitions?**

Career Transitions is a free online tool for job seekers that you can use anywhere you have internet access in Tennessee.

- **Why would people want to use it?**

It's a great way to organize a job search, prep for an interview, or discover a new career path. There's a resume builder and lots of tips and advice on resumes, applying, and interviews.

- **Do I have to know which job I'm applying for?**

No, you can use Career Transitions to discover a new career! This tool will help you identify your interests, browse career paths, match your military or job experience to a new career, and look at schools that will get you on the path to your dream job.

- **How does the interview prep work?**

The interview simulation shows you an example of how to prepare for an interview, and then gives you online practice questions. You start with a job profile and are asked specific questions, then choose the best answer from the 3 provided. This will help you prepare for your own interview.

- **Do you need a password?**

You need to create a free account in Career Transitions to save your resume and cover letter. Click on Sign In and pick a username and password of your choice.

- **How can my patrons connect to this site?**

- **How much do I owe you?**

Career Transitions is already paid for by the State Library. There is no fee to use any part of the Tennessee Electronic Library.
